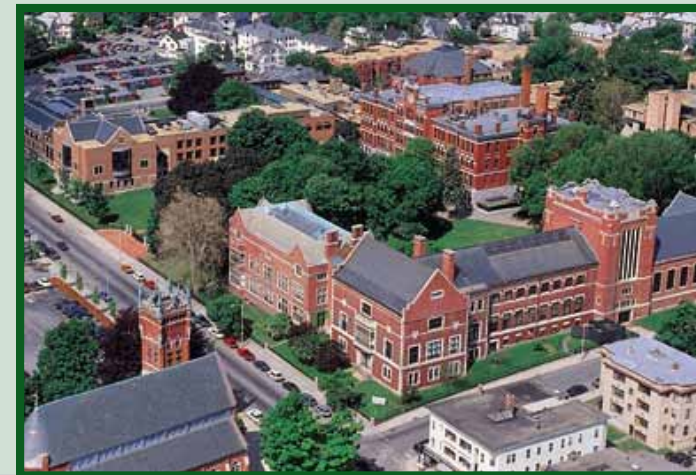
HOLY NAME OF JESUS HOUSE OF STUDIES 2015 – 2016 Information

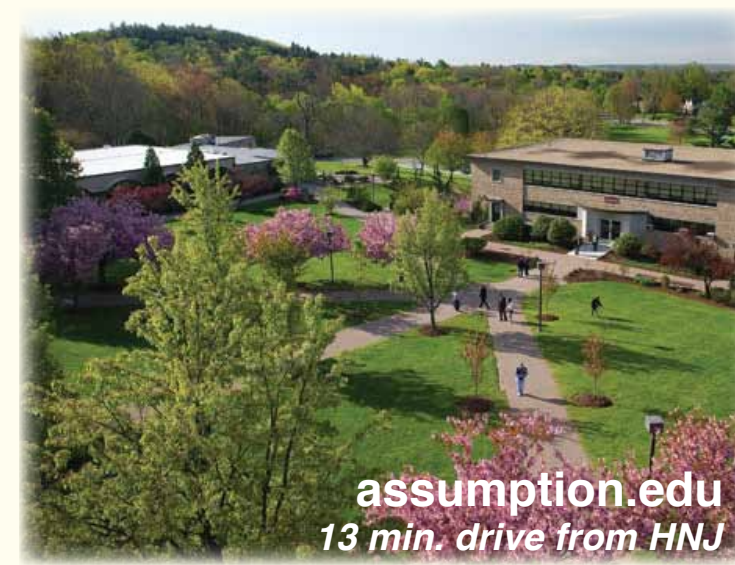

The **H**oly **N**ame of **J**esus House of Studies, dedicated by Bishop Robert J. McManus in 2007, is a three story, forty-six room facility located in Worcester, Massachusetts. The heart of this house is its chapel where Mass, prayers, and devotions are offered daily for the spiritual nourishment of its resident-seminarians.

Sixteen bedrooms are located on the second and third floors of the House of Studies, as well as six private baths and a computer room. A chapel, sacristy, spiritual direction parlor, library, conference room, dining room, and kitchen are located on the first floor. A gymnasium, game room, TV room, music room, workshop, and laundry room are located on the basement level.

Bicycles are maintained for use in warm weather, and a city bus stop is only a 5 minute walk away. Union Station (trains & buses) can be reached by car in ten minutes. Logan (Boston) and T. F. Green (Providence) airports are one hour away via van-shuttle.

Clark's **ESL** program known to students around the world as ALCI (American Culture & Language Institute), offers intensive ESL programs for seminarians who desire to improve their English-language skills while also increasing their knowledge of American culture. The program includes twenty hours per week of Monday through Thursday, morning, afternoon & evening classes of intensive ESL instruction in six levels; small classes taught by dedicated, trained professionals; private tutorial sessions; computer-assisted language learning; audio/video language laboratory; and a diverse international student population. Seminarians are given a placement test at the beginning of the semester to determine which of the following programs best serves their needs: Basic English as a Second Language (BESL), English for Academic Purposes (EAP), and American Studies of Society and Culture (AMST). The institutional Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is offered at the end of each semester to measure a seminarian's progress.

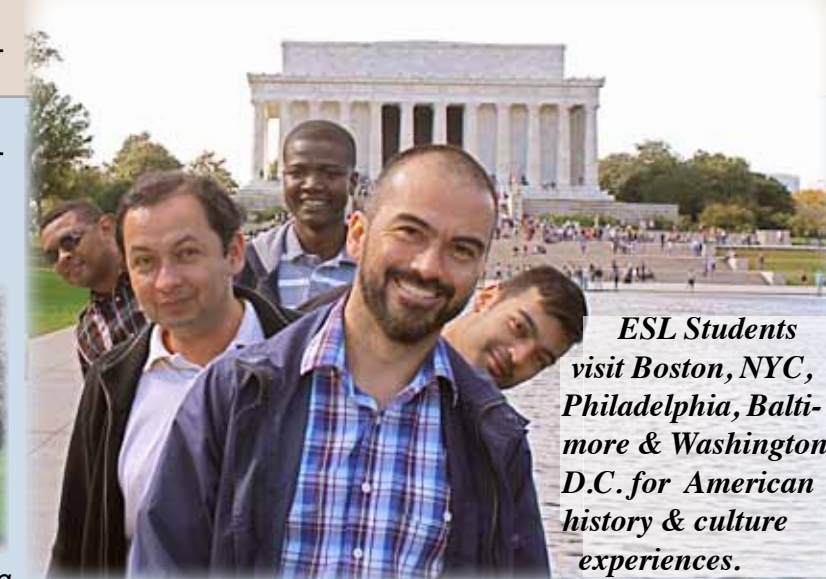


St. Vincent's **CPE** program is nationally accredited through the Association for Clinical Pastoral Education, and is committed to providing high quality professional education in pastoral ministry through programs designed according to ACPE Standards, Level I & II Objectives and Outcomes. Consistent with those standards, students are offered the opportunity to deepen and integrate their pastoral identity and pastoral ministry skills through visitation with patients, peer supervision, didactic seminars and individual supervision focused by an individual learning contract. Chaplain interns gain self-awareness, skills in self-supervision, interpersonal skills, pastoral skills, and conceptual sophistication through the integration of academic knowledge to experiential learning in an action/reflection, adult learner model. The intensive summer unit entails a forty-hour/week commitment and runs five days per week. The program begins the Monday before Memorial Day through the end of July or the beginning August.
